- * Arrives early on meeting day and stays to ensure clean-up is complete.

- Bring dessert to serve at least 12.
- Bring serving utensil and serving plate.
- * Cut small portions so everyone can try some of each.
- * Arrive by 9:30 a.m. to help set-up.
- * There should be more than enough desserts, committee should go home with leftovers to prevent too little at the meeting.
- * If a substitute committee member is needed, locate one.
- * Be prepared to serve shortly after the program concludes.
- * The President, escorting the speaker, always starts the dessert line. Courtesy demands that all others must wait until the dignitaries and guests have gone through the line.
- * Stay and help clean up. Always leave the Center as clean or cleaner than when you arrived.
- * To expedite clean-up, bring a means (box, bag, baggies) of taking home your plate, utensils, and leftovers without having to wash them at the garden center.
- * Don't leave leftovers for staff (at their request)

March 19 — Flower Show Set-up


